

2010 National Boy Scout Jamboree Preliminary Youth Application

**The Mid-America Council will take a contingent of
8 Boy Scout Troops to the 2010 National Jamboree.
That's 288 boys and 32 adult leaders.
Get on the list to go in 2010!**

Qualifications for boys to attend the 2010 Jamboree.

- Be a First Class Boy Scout by July 1, 2010
- Completed the 6th Grade or be at least 12 years of age by July 1, 2010 and not have reached your 18th birthday by August 2, 2010.
- Participate regularly in your Jamboree troop meetings (expect a monthly meeting beginning spring/summer of 2009 through July 2010)
- Participate in Council provided Jamboree specific training
- Mandatory participation in the Shakedown campout. Tentatively June 4-6, 2010 at Camp Cedars.
- Complete a 2010 BSA National Jamboree Application and Jamboree Medical form provided by your Jamboree Scoutmaster – these forms have not yet been released by National – Mid-America Council will provide these form to the Troop Leaders when they become available. The Application form will need to be approved by your home troop Scoutmaster. Details to follow – check the MAC Jamboree web site for updates.

FINANCIAL DETAILS – RESERVE YOUR PLACE NOW WITH A \$100 DEPOSIT. Your \$100 deposit will be applied to your cost-to-go upon receipt of your 2010 BSA National Jamboree Application. Once the official Jamboree Application is completed the \$100 deposit becomes non-refundable. A date when Applications must be completed and turned in will be announced in the future.

The Steering Committee is finalizing details and will have the cost per person in the near future. With a projected 5% annual inflation rate from 2005 expenses, we anticipate the cost for this Jamboree will be about \$1850-\$2000. ***Every effort will be made to bring this fee as low as possible, while preserving the quality of the Jamboree experience.*** Once costs are determined, a payment schedule will be announced with installments due by specific dates. Fundraising opportunities will also be available.

The cost will include: Fully trained and qualified leaders; National admission fee into the 2010 Jamboree (\$795); Round trip airfare; Touring historical and educational sites in and around the Washington D.C. and Williamsburg areas; Lodging (hotels while touring); Most sightseeing fees and admissions (while touring); Motor coach transportation (while touring); Meal allowance (while touring); All meals at Jamboree; 10 days of camping and exciting Jamboree activities at Ft. A.P. Hill, VA; Interaction with scouts from across the country and many foreign countries; Council contingent memorabilia (patches, jacket, t-shirts); Patrol equipment while at the Jamboree; Tents; Patrol cook kitchen; Dining flies; Picnic tables; Stocked patrol boxes; and Lanterns
